She initially had a great appetite, but then stopped eating and began losing the weight she had gained. After running some tests, our team found that she likely did not have long to live-but SAFE Haven never backs down from a fight for a cat's life. The Cat Care team spent twelve weeks treating her and researching the best way to help her. Country Club turned it around and today is a happy, healthy girl! One of our team members who was instrumental in her care fell in love and she was adopted by our team member after 203 days spent at SAFE Haven. She worked hard for her alumni title, and we couldn't be happier for her.

Sweet Miso

In late December, our team got a call that a cat that had been adopted from us was surrendered to a shelter in South Carolina, a ten hour round trip away. The shelter wanted to know if SAFE Haven wanted Sweet Miso back- the answer was YES! Our commitment to our cats is for life. Within a few hours, a volunteer stepped up to go bring her home. Sweet Miso found her new forever home and today is living her best life with her new family. Wendy Darling is a gorgeous gal who first came to us in May of 2019. In late February, one of our volunteers brought in a cat that was found by one of her colony feeders. Even though he was eight months old, Wobbegong had a kitten harness on- he likely was separated from previous owners while wearing the harness and was never able to get it off. Growing up with this restriction, this left his Xiphoid (part of his chest) malformed. He also had a retained third eyelid, likely from a past illness, that Dr. Kutner fixed during surgery. Wobbegong is perfectly fine, just a little differently shaped!



Maeby was five weeks old when she came to us, but she was so sick that she was the size of a two- to three-weekold kitten. Our Cat Care team wasn't deterred - two of them fostered her, syringe feeding her every two hours for about a month. She went from being severely lethargic to climbing up on their laps, to bolting at top speed out of her crate during feeding time. Though she lost her right eye completely and some of the vision in her left, she hasn't lost her playful nature, sometimes running full speed into walls if she gets too carried away while playing! After 101 days with SAFE Haven, Maeby found a wonderful family who brought her and another SAFE Haven cat, Wallaby Wilma, home just in time for the holidays.



Sea Bass is a ten year old world class snuggler! We decided that Sea Bass would be more comfortable in a foster home while he waits to be adopted due to his diabetes. He is currently being cared for by one of our wonderful team members. He likes kids and other cats, and is a very gentle boy and takes his twice daily insulin injections like a champ. He enjoys being brushed and is an excellent biscuit maker!



Phoebey

Phoebey weighed just a little over 3 pounds when she was brought to us by one of our constituents. She had one of the worst cases of hyperthyroidism our team has seen. We got her squared away with her medicineshe loves the pill pocket treats it comes in. Today, she's a little over 7 pounds and is as happy as can be. We're so glad there are cat lovers out there who are keeping their eyes out for these vulnerable ones, and that the kitties like Phoebey make their way to us!


